 - SAVE THE DATE for the new FEAD online event entitled "Waste-to-Energy: an essential element for circularity".
 - Monday 12 April 2021 at 16:00-18:00 CET

Ongoing Surveys and Consultations

- <u>EC Consultation on Environmental crime improving EU</u> <u>rules on environmental protection through criminal law:</u>
 - The Commission has <u>published</u> an initiative Consultation (public questionnaire) on Environmental crime – improving EU rules on environmental protection through criminal law. (EC deadline for feedback is 03 May 2021 - midnight Brussels time).
- <u>EC Consultation on the Revision of the IED & of the E-PRTR</u>
 <u>& Consultant's stakeholders' questionnaire:</u>
 - The Commission has published two initiatives Public Consultations (questionnaires) on the Revision of

the <u>Industrial Emissions Directive</u> and of the <u>E-</u> <u>PRTR</u>. (Please, note that while there are two different initiatives on the EC website, the consultation and the questionnaire are merged).

- The Consultancy Ricardo is also conducting on behalf of the Commission a <u>stakeholders' survey</u> and they have requested our feedback.
 - SFEAD has prepared the preliminary drafts of both the questionnaires related to the revision of the IED.
- On Tuesday 9 March at 14.30-16.00 CET, FEAD will hold an <u>online meeting</u> to discuss Members' positions on the two consultations on the revision of the IED.
 - Ahead of the meeting, we would like to highlight the main issues which may affect the waste management sector:
 - The possible inclusion in the scope of the batteries' disposal and recovery
 - The possible inclusion in the scope of landfills
 - The reduction of thresholds for waste management – biological treatment, to be included among IED activities
 - BAT conclusions to be allowed for landfills covered by IED
 - The change of the default options for setting ELVs (Emission Limit Values) in permits from the higher to the lower limit of the BAT-AEL range
 - The tightening of the conditions for applying derogations from BAT-AELs
 - The insufficient coverage of chemicals of concern (including substances of very high concern (SVHC) and persistent organic pollutants (POPS)) in BREFs and BAT conclusions
 - The consideration of GHG emissions when identifying BAT together with pollutants emissions
 - The extension of the scope of monitoring/reporting to cover resource efficiency improvements

- The Commission has <u>published</u> an initiative Consultation on a Draft Act on Fertilising products - technical update.

- On 01 March 2021, <u>FEAD provided feedback</u> to the EC Public Consultation (questionnaire) on the Proposal for a Regulation on Batteries - modernising EU rules, which is published <u>here</u>.
- On 26 February, <u>FEAD provided feedback</u> to the EC Public Consultation (questionnaire) on Sewage sludge use in farming – evaluation, which is published <u>here</u>.
- On 26 February, <u>FEAD provided feedback</u> to the Consultancy that conducted a survey targeting specific stakeholders on the sewage sludge directive on behalf of the Commission.

Monitoring of EU Institutions

Life of EU institutions

- Commissioner for Environment, Oceans and Fisheries, Virginijus Sinkevičius responded to <u>a question for</u> written answer submitted by EPP MEP Tomislav Sokol (Croatia) on 23 February 2021 under Rule 138 of the European Parliament's Rules of Procedure.
- In its <u>response</u>, Commissioner Sinkevičius noted that following the Circular Economy Action Plan's mandate, the Commission is currently assessing several measures to address excessive and avoidable packaging.
 - In particular, the Commissioner stressed that whilst no estimations of over-packaging were currently available, the Commission was committed to establish a definition and determine the related quantities within the framework of the impact assessment study supporting the expected revision of EU rules on packaging and packaging.
 - Lastly, Commissioner Sinkevičius indicated that, together with the EU legislation on packaging, global initiatives in the field of e-commerce and retail sector were of outmost importance to address over-packaging.

This week's focus: Waste-to-Energy & Taxonomy

- Last week, the Commission held a series of webinars on how the Platform for Sustainable Finance (currently advising the Commission on delegated acts, the definition of technical screening criteria, and the way forward) is proceeding.
- Briefly, here's what we can expect:
 - The Commission will adopt the first delegated act on adaptation and mitigation activities on 21 April 2021.
 - The Commission has asked the Platform to further investigate the scope of transition activities, with a deadline set to mid-end March.
 - The Commission is set to send a draft to Member States and to the Parliament around mid-March (potentially 12 March).

- Just as a reminder, after adoption, MS and the Parliament will have up to 4 months (2+2 if renewed) to raise objections.
- The proposal for a second delegated act (covering objective 3-6, including circular economy) can be expected in the Summer (June/July), with discussions starting in the Platform towards the end of Summer.
- Considering this process, FEAD has kick-started the work on technical screening criteria for waste-to-energy, which we would like to discuss with you, together with a common strategy on the next steps. We suggest organising a short meeting with you next week to gather input on the latter. <u>Please fill in this</u> doodle by Monday, 8 March 2021 COB.
